## Just Enough Room in the Manger

We are told that the baby Jesus was placed in the manger because there was no room in the inn. The word for inn is uncertain, it most likely doesn't mean something like a motel chain of today. An inn might simply point to a room in a home. Whatever the case, it does mean there was no suitable place for human beings available when Joseph and Mary showed up. A manger is just a feed trough for animals. Cozy in size, perhaps, but still makeshift at best.

What is the result of taking up residence among the animals and making use of a manger? The coming of Emmanuel, the birth of Jesus, is reduced to bare essentials: a mother, a child, swaddling cloth, and just enough space to lay the child in a manger. Anything extravagant, anything extraneous, anything that might draw attention from the essence of the moment is missing.

What then is left? Just as there was no room in the inn for the holy family, so there isn't a lot of room in the manger for things that do not belong here. There is no room in the manger for the aspirations of power or prestige of a Caesar or a Quirinius.

As well, there is no room in the manger for the prejudice of heart, no room for pride or prestige that would crowd out the hospitality of God. The angels announce what is placed in the manger, the peace of God, the joy of heaven. The means there is no room for bitterness or greed in the manger.

The lessons appointed for Christmas tell us all we need to know about what God places in the manger, and what is crowded

out. There is room for grace and salvation. The swaddling cloth holds tightly the child who is redeemer, savior, prince of peace. Between the infant and the edges of the manger, the humble padding of straw allows just enough room for the imagination to see how the infant Jesus will grow into a man who always had time and attention for those on the margins of society.


Yet for all the constraints, there is room enough. There is room in the manger for the disciples Jesus will call. There is room in the manger for all the parables of the kingdom of God, room for the good Samaritan, and the prodigal son. There is room for the cross and a crown of thorns. There is room for the empty tomb.

There is room enough to adjust our expectations to see what God truly makes possible in the manger. Emmanuel, God with us. That's what is in the manger. Nothing more, but then room enough for all of heaven and earth. Which means, there is room for you and me in the manger. The constraints of a manger, the simplicity of the scene focus our attention to what is essential to remember. Grace and mercy come to us in Jesus.

## Remarkable Celebration Weekend

This year's Celebration Weekend was one we will never forget and with good reason. In the middle of a pandemic, 233 families and individuals brought forward Estimate of Giving Cards on our Celebration Weekend Nov. 15, pledging \$934,885. Both the number of pledges received and total

dollars pledged is a five year high. For those who returned their cards, this response represents an increase of \$59,539 or about a 7% increase for this same group of people from last year. Included in this amount are a record 37 new pledgers who pledged \$78,454. Interestingly enough all of these new pledgers are current members who were non-pledge givers during 2020. This new group alone pledged to increase their giving by \$22,120 or 39% over their current level. Pr. Craig said, "I think this signals a deeper spiritual commitment from

our people during this remarkable year full of incredibly challenging circumstances."

Director of Support Services Bob Koenig added, "Terrific results so far, with more pledges being returned each day...Nice work Generosity Team!!" We want to thank our entire church for your help in putting this tremendous campaign together including our 2020 Generosity Team of Lesa Ackman, Melissa Bishop, Andy Jacobsen, Dick Johnson, Nicole Keating, Scott Lindsley, Julie Roberts, Dana Rohrssen, Tom Schamberger, Mark Schwarting, and Ruthie Trudo.

## SEMP 2020 Wrap up

As 2020 comes to a close, we note 33+ years of providing a Saturday Evening Meal to persons in our community who are food insecure. EVERY SATURDAY in spite of ice storms, holidays, church remodeling, and yes, even Covid-19 and the derecho! It looks a lot different right now, but when the pandemic is over, and restrictions are lifted, we will reassess SEMP teams and update our faithful volunteers, so stay tuned!

FLC members have been wonderfully generous in remembering SEMP in their gift-giving, and it is much appreciated. We

have substantially increased the number of persons served out of the FLC kitchen from around 600 a month in early 2020, to 2,400+ for the month of November. Much of our increase is from the four meals we provide every weekend for the Community Overflow Homeless Shelter which has been open all year due to Covid and the derecho, rather than just in the winter months as in the past.

A former SEMP guest, who expresses gratitude for food and the kindness and caring he experienced with our volunteers, recently contacted us and has provided thanksgiving turkeys and Christmas Hams! He is in a much better situation now and was eager to give back.

Through the teachings of Jesus and the story of Saul we will learn how to love people who aren't like us, love people who are in need, love the people we envy, and even love the people we want to hate.

## CARES Act Provides Opportunities for Year-End Charitable Giving

As we approach the end of 2020, we wanted to make you aware of the following temporary incentives for giving included in the March 2020, Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving in hopes of stimulating philanthropy throughout America. The window for taking advantage of these changes closes on December 31, 2020.

*Are you itemizing deductions?* (you plan on using Schedule A as part of your Form 1040) For those donors who itemize their deductions, and therefore directly write off gifts to charity, the deduction cap has been raised to 100% of adjusted gross income (earlier cap was 60%). For example, if John Taxpayer has an AGI of \$175,000, he would normally be able to deduct up to \$105,000 for gifts to charity. With the temporary changes in the CARES Act, John could now deduct up to his full AGI of \$175,000 if he gives that much to charity in 2020.

*Not itemizing?* (you do not plan on using Schedule A as part of your Form 1040) For the 9 out of 10 people who no longer itemize their charitable giving, the CARES Act will allow these individual taxpayers to deduct donations to charity of up to \$300 on their 2020 federal tax return, even though they take the standard deduction. Married-filing-jointly taxpayers will get the same above-the-line deduction of up to \$300.

*What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?* The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income. Please contact your financial advisor to further explore the possibility of a gift from your IRA.
