Church Council Approves Return to Limited Worship April 17

First Lutheran's Church Council approved the return to in person worship beginning Saturday, April 17 at a special meeting at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 11. The major decision to re-open the doors to worshipers in a safe and responsible manner came at the recommendation from the Return to Worship Task Force on March 10. The task force made the recommendation to return to in person worship starting with Saturday evening services at 5 p.m. Saturday April 17 & 24 and all services (5 p.m. Saturday, 9 & 11 a.m. Sunday) starting May 1 & 2.

Our diverse task force came to this recommendation after first creating a guiding statement that "The goal of the Return to Worship Task Force consensus is a safe, phased return to in-house worship with regard to public health and minimizing risks to our congregation." The task force felt the initial re-open is in line with this goal based on current medical evidence including the 7-Day Positivity Rate for Covid-19 in Iowa is down to 3.8% (as of our meeting date on 3/10) and we have currently the lowest number of Iowans hospitalized for Covid (167) since last July. Additionally, a majority of our worship leaders have now received the full dose of the vaccine. Throughout this process the task force will continue to meet bi-weekly to monitor the Covid data, and our recommendations are subject to changes as we monitor the evolution of Covid in our Cedar Rapids and Linn County community closely.

The Task Force reviewed and supported the public safety measures our staff have already put in place for this initial re-opening including requiring everyone to wear a mask, no singing, no communion, no passing of the peace or shaking hands with the pastor, no passing the offering plate, and no coffee or donuts. There will be no bulletins or hymnals. Worshipers would come in one designated door and exit another other. We will have worshippers sign up in advance online and cap attendance at 100 (25% capacity) of our 400+ seat sanctuary.

This date was partly chosen because our organ installer Parsons Organ Builders informed us the sanctuary will be open for us to use for services starting the weekend of April 17-18. We will worship online and outside in the parking lot on Easter Sunday, April 4. The crew will arrive on the Tuesday after Easter and will consume the sanctuary as a construction site that following weekend, April 10-11.

The next job for the Return to Worship Task Force will be discuss what would have to happen to cause our team to push back or halt our current plans to re-open on April 17. We will also discuss what should be included in the subsequent phases of re-opening following our initial re-open (i.e. offering communion, shaking hands, etc.) and what health markers we feel we need to see for the church to advance through those individual phases in the future.

Returning to Worship Do's -&- Don'ts

- You must reserve your place for worship ahead of time by visiting our website firstlutherancr.org and clicking on "Worship Registration" on the main page or by calling the church office at 365-1494
- Stay home if you are feeling ill
- Stay home if you suspect you were recently exposed to CoVid, or are awaiting test results.
- Capacity will start at 100 people; 25%
- Masks are Required in the Building at all times.
- We will not use bulletins or hymnals.
- We will not have Holy Communion.
- We will not have Congregational Singing.



Streaming Worship Will Continue

With the return to limited in-person worship starting, we also want to be clear that this will not mean the end of our streaming worship experiences. In fact, we encourage the majority of the congregation to continue using online as their primary worship experience for the time being. A number of people have shared their desire to maintain the streaming worship for when people are traveling, are ill, or have other events dictate their schedule during our weekly worship times.

Please Continue Streaming!

If those of you who have made use of our live streaming worship services continue to do so, it will allow us to offer in-person seating to individuals who do not have the means to participate online. This will be especially important as we will only have a 100-seat capacity for our initial in-person worship services. If you are like one member who quipped, "I've gotten kinda used to worshiping in my pajamas!" please continue to enjoy the experience.

For over a decade now we have offered our Sermon videos online for people to watch in case you miss worship or want to go back and hear something again. In much the same way, we have now obtained the proper licenses and permissions to record and broadcast the full worship liturgies and music so we can continue to live stream our worship services into the future.



Our Worship Streaming platform firstlutherancr.online.church is here to stay.

Dear Friends in Christ,


I have now received my two COVID shots, and I want to share some of the reasons for getting vaccinated.

Doing so will hasten that day when we can return fully and freely to worship, communion, and perhaps that ultimate threshold of community health — a donut hole and cup of coffee between services. Sunday Morning Grief Series

These last twelve months have been a year of remarkable difficulty in many ways, and for some it had the added dimension of the death of someone close. Many have not in normal ways been able to honor the memories or to receive the comfort and support of family members, friends, and church families. Many have had no funeral services or celebrations of life for their loved ones. Some have held services and gatherings but with very limited participation. There can be a lack of closure and heightened or prolonged grief.

A short series held on Zoom will offer opportunity to explore losses, share grieving, and begin or continue closure. Online access will be necessary. A link to the Zoom connection may be found on the First Lutheran website, firstlutheran-cr.org, or in the streaming worship chat. Please call prior to the meeting time if you have questions.

The word “grief” is the simple shorthand we use for what is actually a highly complex mixture of thoughts and feelings. Grief is everything we think and feel inside after someone we love dies or leaves or something we are attached to goes away. In other words, grief is the instinctive human response to loss.

Grief is natural and necessary. It is not something to be afraid of, hide from, or think of as “bad” or “weak.” It is not an illness or mental-health problem. If you are grieving, rest assured that what you are experiencing is not only normal, grief helps us heal.

New Organ Arriving Soon!

After a long wait to work around pandemic travel restrictions, our masterpiece of a new organ is currently beginning the dismantling and packing process to ship the organ to Iowa. The first semi trailer is packed, and the second is under way. These semis containing the organ are scheduled to arrive at First Lutheran on Monday, April 6.

PLEASE NOTE: As exciting as this is, there can be no visitors on site when they are unloading and assembling the organ, and there will be no access to view it. We will provide pictures or video updates as possible in cooperation with the Parsons Organ Builders team.

There are several stages of construction and preparation that needs to take place once the organ is here. First, the Installation crew consisting of 12-13 Parsons artisans will then spend the first 4 weeks—most of April—to re-assemble and install the organ in our balcony.


9 a.m. Easter Sunday, April 4

Kitchen Prepared for Increased Use

It is spring cleaning time, and the FLC kitchen is no exception. The walls have been scrubbed and painted, floor power washed, and lighting improved. An upgrade to the cooking area will occur in April when the stove is replaced with a narrow style (still 6 burners) and double stack convection ovens. That will increase oven space from 8 pans to 14!

This was made possible by grants and gifts to the SEMP Ministry, which is a major user of the FLC kitchen and improves our ability to prepare food for large groups.

The home model freezer in the hall pantry will be replaced with a double door commercial model, increasing our storage and ability to accept frozen food donations when they are available.

Regular SEMP volunteer teams will not resume functioning until we can gather inside without restrictions. When funeral luncheons, Keenagers, SEMP and other FLC member meals are ready to resume, the kitchen will be ready to welcome you with renewed facilities.
